

**TUAHU TRACK** Start 9:00am \*Limited Spaces

Meet: End of Hot Springs Road, Katikati

This track winds through the Waihou Valley Pine Forest, climbing steeply up the western side to reach the North-South Track. Enjoy stunning views from the summit, before crossing the Te Rereatukahia Stream. Descend the eastern Kaimais past mature kauri trees, ending back at Hot Springs Road.



OROKAWA TRIG WALK

Start 9:00am Meet: Water Reservoir C/Park, Waihi Beach

The Orokawa Trig walk offers sweeping views over the Bay of Plenty and Orokawa Beach. Start by crossing the scenic Waihi Beach Stream track, passing waterfalls before a steep climb to the Fire Break track. Continue over a stile, through farmland, and out to the Orokawa Trig.



WHARF ST WALK TO MARITIME PARK &

MUSEUM ENDING WITH RIVER BOAT CRUISE Meet: Wharf Street, Paeroa Start 8:30am

Walk the Hauraki Rail Trail to the Historical Maritime Park. Take in the gardens and museum, returning via a River cruise of Ohinemuri & Waihou Rivers to Paeroa.



WHARF ST RIVER BOAT CRUISE TO MARITIME PARK & MUSEUM, THEN WALK RETURN Start 11:30am Meet: Wharf Street, Paeroa

Start with a cruise of Ohinemuri & Waihou Rivers, arriving at the Historical Maritime Park. Take in the gardens and museum, returning via the Hauraki Rail Trail to Paeroa



KATIKATI MURAL TOUR WALK

Meet: The Arts Junction, 36 Main Road, Katikati \*Limited Spaces

A wonderful opportunity to learn about the murals and the towns history with a guided tour of some of the 80 plus pieces of art in the collection. Tours only take an hour and are concentrated in the centre of Katikati.



UNION HILL WALK

Start 10am Meet: George Street C/Park, Waihi

Explore Gilmour Reserve, visiting the Tunnellers Memorial, Pike River 29, and Miners Rest, plus park developments. Then, loop around Union Hill to see the vent shaft, pachuca tanks, battery site, and tailings ponds. Finish with the Millstream Walkway, butterfly garden, bamboo grove, and Speaks Quarry.



WIRES TRACK LOOP

Start 9am Meet: Water Reservoir C/Park, Waihi Beach

Discover the remnants of Waihi Beach's section of Old Wires Track, which connected telegraphic communication between Auckland and Wellington, passing the old dam and Rewarewa trees.



**LUCK AT LAST** 

Start 9am Meet: Corner, Port & Harbour View Roads, Ti Toki Reserve, Whangamata

An easy walk along an old carriageway bounded by native trees and the Wharekawa Stream. View assorted mining machinery relics, left over from the 1897 workings.



KAURI WALK TO DICKEY FLAT

Meet: Dickey Flat Adventure Camp, Waikino

Hike along the Waitawheta River, past the few ancient kauri trees. Take in the settings along Dean, Mangakino and Dickey Flat Tracks. End with billy tea and toasted marshmallows over the fire at Dickey Flat Adventure Camp.



**OWHAROA FALLS HERITAGE** 

**BIKE AND TRAIN RIDE** 

Start 10am Meet: Waihi Bicycle Hire, 126 Seddon Street, Waihi Scenic cycle to Owharoa Falls exploring the rich history along the way, through gentle farmland, then return to Waihi via the Goldfields Heritage Railway.



**TÜHUA (MAYOR ISLAND)** 

Start 6:45am Meet: Tauranga Bridge Marina, 101 Te Awanui Dr LIMITED SPACES AVAILABLE

Join us for an adventurous day on Mayor Island! After a 2hour boat trip, we'll hike a challenging route along the crater rim, tackling rugged terrain, the Devil's Staircase, and Ruru Pass. Expect root climbing, ladders, and even some handsand-knees crawling-this trek is for the brave!

WAIOTAHI - KARAKA LOOP

Meet: Karaka DOC Park, 501 Karaka Road, Thames

Led by the Kauaeranga Tramping Club, this hike begins with a steep climb through bush before leveling out. Enjoy views over the Firth of Thames before descending to the Karaka Track, returning via the Red Rocks (named for their vivid lichen).



**DUBBO 96 TRACK LOOP WALK** 

Start 9am Meet: Karangahake Gorge C/Park

Starting at the Karangahake Gorge carpark, cross the swing bridge and follow the upper trail to Scotsman Gully. Then, take a left onto the country road for a gradual 1km climb. The Dubbo 96 track branches off the County Road/No 7 Level



WAIHI CEMETERY WALK Start 2:45pm

Meet: Waihi Cemetery, Waihi

Guided Waihi Cemetery Walk with Waihi Branch of the New Zealand Society of Genealogists. The theme - "More Wonderful Women of Waihi". A guided walk telling the stories of some of the "More Wonderful Women of Waihi".



Start 10am Meet: Beach Reserve, Island View Road, Access #14, Whangamata

Ocean kayak to Whenuakura (Donut) Island with guides from Surfsup NZ. This short paddle rewards you with breathtaking scenery and the stunning sanctuary of Whenuakura Island, part of a protected group off the Whangamata coast.

Start 9am Meet: Papamoa Cultural Regional Park, Poplar Lane Join us for an enriching experience at the Papamoa Hills Cultural Regional Park and Summerhill Farm Trails. This guided walk to the Trig, 224m, offers breathtaking panoramic views of the Bay of Plenty, showcasing the region's stunning landscapes.

**TRAIL & SOAK** Meet: C/Park, 274 Hot Springs Road, Katikati Start 9:30am This adventurous walk starts at the pool's carpark, with raised platforms over Kauri roots, steep sections and unbridged stream crossings. Suitable for those with good fitness and sturdy footwear. Afterward, relax with your packed lunch in the outdoor spa or book a private spa at the main office (extra cost).



WAIRERE TO TE TUHI TRACK

SAPPHIRE SPRINGS NATURE

Start 9am Meet: Wairere Falls C/Park, Goodwin Road, Okavia We'll start at the Wairere Falls carpark, climbing to a lookout with views of the 153m two-stage drop of Wairere Falls. Continue to the summit (weather permitting). From there, follow the North-South track south, turning onto the Te Tuhi track for a steady downhill descent, ending with a stream crossing and a final climb to stunning southern views.



WALK THROUGH MARTHA MINE PIT FENCE

Start 10am Meet: Martha Mine Entrance, 140 Kenny St, Waihi OceanaGold invites you to a walk inside the Martha mine pit fence along the perimeter road. Enjoy unique views of the mine, with stops to see local Waihi icons. We'll exit on the north-west side and return via the popular Pit Rim Walkway to the carpark.



**OPOUTERE BEACH & FOREST WALK** 

Start 9am Meet: Cnr. Port & Harbour View Rds, Ti Toki Reserve We walk with Whangamata Ramblers Club along a very tranquil beach walk for 4 km and returning through the forestry. We may see some birds nesting in the area. A total of 8 km of flat walk, we stop for lunch along the way. Back



HOMUNGA BAY TO WAIHI BEACH Start 9am

Meet: Waihi Beach Surf Club Transport takes you from Waihi Beach to the start, high above Homunga Bay. This coastal walk takes you along headlands, cliffs and through stream gullies filled with Puriri, Pohutukawa and Nikau palms. Discover remnants of coastal forest and old mine tunnels, showcasing the area's gold-mining history—a truly varied and picturesque journey.



Start 7pm Meet: End of Pikirangi Road (off 834 Wright Road) FRI Join Aongatete Outdoor Education Centre for a magical night walk through Aongatete forest. Discover glowworms, weta and spiders that come alive after dark. Weather permitting, we'll

## MOUNT KARANGAHAKE SUMMIT WALK

Start 9am Meet: Karangahake Gorge C/Park

Start 8am Meet: Convenient Cow, Hikutaia The Wires Track, named after the old telephone line that once ran through Maratoto, still features remnants of poles and a cattle pen fence. The well-marked trail offers lovely views across Maratoto, but can be steep in spots, ending at the

Start 9:30am Meet: End of Pikirangi Road (off 834 Wright Road) Join the Aongatete Forest Project for an educational 2.2km walk around the Aongatete Short Loop. Discover the fascinating world of fungi and their vital role in the ecosystem on this guided stroll, exploring these quirky yet often



#### **OTANEWAINUKU TRIG + RIMU &** WHATAROA FALLS TRACK

Start 9am Meet: Otanewainuku Forest C/Park, 701 Mountain Rd Begin with the Summit Loop, climbing through native forest to stunning panoramic views. Continue through the Rimu Loop, surrounded by towering trees, before resting at the tranquil Whataroa Waterfall-perfect for lunch and a refreshing swim.



#### NIGHT TIME IN THE BUSH GLOW WORM WALK

Start 6pm Meet: Te Aroha Information Centre, 102 Whitaker St Adventure for the little people as we make our way into the forest as the stars and night creatures come out. We will follow the Upper Domain Track and look for titiwai (glow worms) and ruru (morepork). Bring a torch.



## TECT PARK NATIVE TREE WALK

Start 10:30am

Native tree identification walk: TECT Park has many

regenerating areas of natural bush. Join us on a walk through the bush, identifying native trees and looking at points of interest. Expect to be an active member of the group as you search for a variety of plants, berries and flowers en route.



Start 8:30am Meet: End of Hot Springs Road, Katikati The Sentinel Rock Lookout Walk, accessible from the Tuahu Track near Tuahu Kauri (25 mins from the carpark), is a challenging hike for those with moderate to high fitness. The steep, rough trail may require some scrambling but rewards you with stunning valley views from the lookout.



## WAIORONGOMAI LOW LEVEL LOOP

Start 9am Meet: Information Centre, 102 Whitaker St, Te Aroha Join in this leisurely walk around Waiorongomai Low Level Loop and learn about the history and flora of this old gold mining area. With mining relics, regenerating bush and a few small streams, this valley is one of the North Island's best kept



#### DISCOVERY MINE & OROKAWA LOOP TRACK

Meet: Waihi Beach Water Reservoir C/Park Passing the Discovery Mine site, learn about this early Waihi Beach mining venture before following the stream, crossing it several times, heading past waterfalls. A 10-minute climb offers views over Orokawa Reserve, then descends passing a nikau grove to Orokawa Beach.

## **TARURU CREEK BATTERY SITES**

This walk starts at Dickson Holiday Park carpark, following the road to the Sylvia Battery while visiting six historic sites: Bleazard's, Brown and Campbell's, Flora McDonald, Russell's, Wild Missouri, and Sylvia Battery. Return via the same route. Info packs provided. Part of the NZ Week of Archaeology.

Start 9am Meet: Dickson Holiday Park C/Park, 115 Victoria St



Discover the magnificent Tuahu Kauri along an old Māori route. A 20-minute walk leads to a platform around one of the Bay of Plenty's largest kauri trees. Afterward, enjoy mid-morning tea at the Arts Junction with a homemade hiking bar and cacao, plus nutrition tips from Ginny to boost energy.


### TUI DOMAIN TRACK Start 9am Meet: Information Centre, 102 Whitaker St, Te Aroha

This gentle walk along the Tui Domain Track on Mt Te Aroha ncludes a 10-minute detour to Tutumangao Falls. Continue to Tui Rd for another waterfall and the historic Mayflower Mine. Return the same way and enjoy a relaxing soak in the hot pools.

# TE KURA A MAIA

Start 9am Meet: Waipaopao (Anzac Bay) C/Park, Bowentown Reon Tuanau of Te Whānau a Tauwhao will share with us the area's rich cultural history throughout the morning. This gentle walk offers stunning views of Te Moana a Toi with time taken to stop and be enriched with this land's stories. An opportunity not to be missed!



# PINNACLES WALK

Start 8am

Meet: Kauaeranga Road end C/Park This popular walk leads to the Pinnacles Hut and summit, offering spectacular views of the Coromandel Peninsula. Follow an old packhorse route used by kauri bushmen in the 1920s, ascending Webb Creek Track to Hydro Camp, where rock steps eased the way for packhorses during the kauri logging era.



### SHOREBIRD CENTRE Start 9:30am Meet: 283 East Coast Road, Pükorokoro, Miranda

Explore the fascinating world of shorebirds at the Shorebird Centre. Learn about these unique birds, then head 2km to the Bird Hides for a closer look. You can walk the trail from the Centre or drive 2km to the nearby car park and walk from there.

#### HALLS ARBORETUM Start 9:30am

Meet: Top End of Currie St, Parawai, Thames Join local archaeologist Dave Wilton for a guided walk as part of the Echo Walking Festival and National Archaeology Week. Explore Hall's Arboretum, established in the 1870s, and Parawai Mission Station from 1837. Hall's Arboretum, a key site in the 1913 Royal Commission on Forestry, has influenced NZ forestry policy to this day.
